Risk Factor	Impact Summary
Housing Scarcity	Finding a private long-term rental typically takes 4-12 weeks with real competition; many newcomers spend 3-6 months in serviced or short-let before securing stable housing.
30% Ruling Taper	The expat tax ruling is being reduced (30%/20%/10% over 5 years structure). Tax-net-of-ruling calculations based on old assumptions no longer hold.
Climate (Damp + Dark)	Nov-Feb daylight averages under 8 hours with high cloud cover. SAD is a documented issue; light therapy and winter exits are common.
Bike Theft + Damp Housing	Bike theft is near-universal at the 1-2-year mark; older canal-house stock has damp/heating issues that surprise newcomers from drier climates.
Energy Costs	Post-2022 energy price shock has softened but EUR 150-350/month for gas+electric is typical for 70-100m2 stock; heat-pump conversion is accelerating but uneven.
Overtourism Backlash	City has restricted short-lets, capped cruise ship visits, and is tightening rules on tourist-visible business. Long-term residents are largely insulated but policy direction is restrictive.
