Digital Nomad Visa	Well-defined DNV path with workable income floor (EUR 2,650/month).
Climate + Beach	Mediterranean climate plus genuine urban beach access (Barceloneta, Bogatell, Bogatell-Mar Bella).
Tech Cluster (Poblenou)	The 22@ district anchors a real tech economy, not just a nomad layer.
European Connectivity	BCN airport plus high-speed rail to Madrid (2.5h), Paris (6.5h), Lyon, and beyond.
Menu-del-Dia Economics	Lunch economics (EUR 12-18 for 3 courses) that make the Standard budget genuinely comfortable.
Walkable Urbanism	Cerda grid + superblock program make central Barcelona one of the most walkable large cities in Europe.
Healthcare System	Strong public (CatSalut) system plus excellent private (Quiron, Teknon); expats favour private for speed.
Cultural Capital	MACBA, MNAC, Fundacio Miro, Picasso Museum + live music and festival scene (Primavera, Sonar).

Key Risks

Risk Factor	Impact Summary
Anti-Tourism Sentiment	Graffiti, demonstrations, and local political pressure target short-term rentals and tourist-heavy behaviour. Long-term leases and local integration largely neutralise this.
Short-Term-Rental Crackdown	Barcelona is phasing out all tourist short-term rental licences by 2028. Short-stay housing options will shrink materially; lock in long-term leases.
Petty Crime (Tourist Zones)	Pickpocketing on Las Ramblas, Metro L3, and the beach is endemic. Non-tourist zones are low-incident.
DNV Tax Treatment	DNV holders face a flat 24% tax up to EUR 600k/year on Spanish-source income; consult a Spanish tax adviser before committing.
Catalan Political Cycle	Independence movement cycles and Catalan/Spain relations can produce periodic disruption (demonstrations, strikes). Low-impact for expats but a feature of civic life.
August Shutdown	Many local businesses, schools, and service providers close for 2-4 weeks in August. Plan renewals, tax filings, and major setup outside this window.
