01. Executive Summary

Chiang Mai has emerged as a compelling relocation destination for remote workers, digital nomads, and international professionals. As of 2026, this report by Living Cost Atlas provides a rigorous, data-driven assessment of the city's cost landscape, livability metrics, and relocation risk profile.

Risk Factor	Impact Summary
Burning Season PM2.5	Feb-Apr air quality routinely exceeds AQI 200 and often 300+. N95 masks and whole-home HEPA filtration are standard among long-termers; many plan seasonal exits.
Limited Specialist Healthcare	General private healthcare (Bangkok Hospital Chiang Mai, Chiang Mai Ram) is excellent; serious/specialist cases often route to Bangkok.
Scooter Accident Risk	Scooter is default transport; accident rate is lower than Bali but still material. Helmet + insurance discipline matters.
Seasonal Flooding	Peak monsoon (Sep-Oct) occasionally floods riverside and low-lying districts; historically manageable.
Airport Connectivity	CNX is mostly regional; long-haul almost always requires a Bangkok transfer adding 3-5h and a second-leg fare. Plan travel assuming BKK as hub.
Community Saturation	The compact nomad scene means faces repeat at 3 coworking spaces; positive for community depth, mildly claustrophobic for some.
