Risk Factor	Impact Summary
Housing Search + Garant Requirement	Most landlords require a French-resident guarantor or Garantme/Visale insurance plus 3x-rent income; first-month flat hunts often fail without a relocation agent.
Administrative Density	Prefecture appointments, CAF, Securite Sociale, and Ameli set-up routinely consume 3-6 months. French-language forms are standard.
High Tax Burden	Top marginal income tax plus social contributions push effective rates above 50% at many brackets; Talent Passport holders get some simplification, not a tax break.
Strikes + Service Disruption	National strike cycles affect rail, metro, and occasionally air travel. Rarely disruptive to daily life, but factor into travel planning.
Pickpocketing (Tourist Zones)	Metro 1, 4, 9; Trocadero, Gare du Nord, Louvre, Sacre-Coeur are active pickpocket zones. Non-tourist residential districts are low-incident.
Energy + Heating Costs	Electric/gas bills in 40-80m2 Haussmannian stock can run EUR 150-350/month in winter; older buildings often have poor insulation.
