01. Executive Summary

Prague has emerged as a compelling relocation destination for remote workers, digital nomads, and international professionals. As of 2026, this report by Living Cost Atlas provides a rigorous, data-driven assessment of the city's cost landscape, livability metrics, and relocation risk profile.

“Prague in 2026 sits in a strategic sweet spot: EU and Schengen membership, a Zivnostensky List (trade licence) route that remains one of the cheapest EU self-employment pathways, rents and daily costs 30-50% below comparable Western European capitals, and an architecturally intact historic core that makes the city genuinely pleasant to live in rather than tourist-through.”

Key Risks

Risk Factor	Impact Summary
Czech-Only Administration	Tax, immigration, and most official paperwork defaults to Czech. Budget for translator support or a relocation specialist for the first 6-12 months.
Winter Climate	Dec-Feb is cold and often grey; air quality sometimes elevates during inversion-heating days. Not extreme, but a real factor for new arrivals.
Housing Tightening	Vinohrady and Karlin rents have risen materially since 2021; expect 2-6 weeks active search for a quality long-term flat.
Over-Tourism in Centre	Mala Strana and Old Town are tourist-saturated; residential quality of life is unaffected outside those zones.
Pickpocketing + Currency Scams	Old Town tram routes (22/23), Wenceslas Square, and Vaclavske namesti have active pickpocketing; currency-exchange shops in tourist zones routinely swindle. Use Revolut, Wise, or bank ATMs.
DPH/VAT Reporting (Zivno)	Zivnostensky holders above CZK 2M/year annual turnover must VAT-register and file monthly/quarterly returns; Czech accountant essential.
