01. Executive Summary

Tokyo has emerged as a compelling relocation destination for remote workers, digital nomads, and international professionals. As of 2026, this report by Living Cost Atlas provides a rigorous, data-driven assessment of the city's cost landscape, livability metrics, and relocation risk profile.

Risk Factor	Impact Summary
Earthquake + Seismic	Tokyo is on multiple seismic faults; a major earthquake is a real statistical event. Building codes are world-class but factor seismic readiness into housing choice.
Language Barrier (Non-Tourist)	Banking, leasing, healthcare, and most official paperwork default to Japanese. English layers exist in specific zones but are narrow.
Housing Access for Foreigners	Many landlords still avoid foreign tenants; guarantor companies (Nihon SafetyDF, Epos) and "gaijin-friendly" listings are the workaround.
Typhoon Season (Aug-Oct)	Periodic typhoons disrupt transit and flights; city infrastructure absorbs them well but planning around the window matters.
Summer Heat + Humidity	Jul-Aug regularly hits 33-37C with 70-85% humidity; climate shift has pushed summers notably worse vs 2010. Heat-island effect in central wards is substantial.
DNV Income Floor	JPY 10M (~USD 65k) annual income requirement excludes most independent nomads. Plan employer-sponsored or Business Manager visa for serious residency.
